For decades the Band Program at Bloomington High School has produced outstanding performances and trained musicians to be able to perform not only in school music groups, but in college ensembles and a variety of other venues outside of the academic environment. We are proud of the musicians who have been members of the bands through the years, many of whom have gone on to performing in college bands and even into professional musical careers. Whether a student chooses a career in music or not, he or she will have the tools to make music a satisfying part of life. Our students learn more than just how to play an instrument in an acceptable fashion – they learn about music history, music theory and composition, and the artistry of interpretation that is necessary to communicate effectively with an audience.

The key to our success is *daily incremental achievement*. There are no “quick fixes” in music training – each performer needs to spend some time each day honing skills and learning and reinforcing concepts. We have designed our activities so that our students work toward goals every day. While the daily change may not be large, the results certainly are, and performers learn how to approach music on their own as they grow in our bands. It is our hope that each band member elects to remain in the program for all four years of high school. The curriculum is designed so that students who do so will learn new and interesting things each year, while always keeping an emphasis on the basics of fine performance. Some areas of the curriculum are required so the student receives a solid grounding in the fundamentals, and others allow the student to make his or her own choices based on personal interest.

- Regular evening rehearsals: Monday and Thursday nights, 6:00pm to 8:30pm (stops after our competitive season ends)
- Home football games (Fridays)

- 1-2 Parades
- Participation in Marching Band is mandatory for all band members
- Opportunities for students to join the *color guard* or learn new instruments

Concert/Symphonic Band

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I be involved in sports and still be in band?

Yes! We have many athletes in the band program, representing football, soccer, swimming, diving, cheerleading, volleyball, cross country, basketball, track, golf and more! We also have students that participate in Scholastic Bowl, speech team, drama, rotary...you name it! The key to participating in multiple activities is the balancing of time between activities and academics.

How do grades work in band?

It is very easy to get an "A" in band! During marching band season, the bulk of the grade is rooted in attendance and effort. If a student attends all rehearsals and performances, has their music memorized, and works hard in rehearsals, they will be great! Once we shift to concert band season, the grades are based more on performance exams and rehearsal etiquette, with a continued emphasis on *personal growth*. How does a student achieve personal growth? PRACTICE! (and we strongly encourage private lessons!)

***please note that an unexcused absence from a performance will automatically result in a failing grade for the marking period, and supersedes all other components of the grade.*

Can I play my band instrument in the orchestra?

Each year, the top several players from each section will be selected to participate in the BHS Orchestra. This elite group of wind and percussion players will rehearse once a week with Ms. Monhardt and the string orchestra, and further increase their musical experience!

What other musical opportunities are available for me?

There are excellent musical opportunities throughout BHS and the Bloomington-Normal community. BHS has a wonderful choral program; there are opportunities for participation in the school musical and pit orchestra; an Advanced-Placement Music Theory course is offered at BHS; there are community bands and orchestras in the area; there is a wealth of musical cultures and professional instructors at nearby ISU and IWU; a wonderful concert venue in Braden Auditorium; the Bands of America Summer Symposium held on the ISU campus.....*the list goes on and on!*
