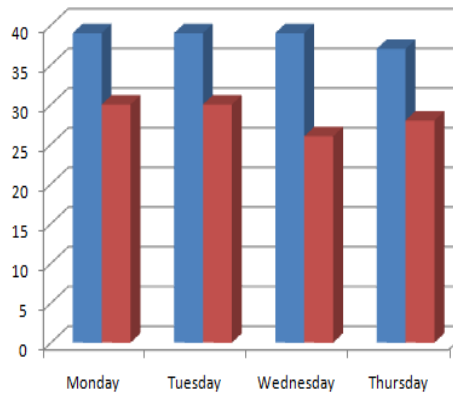
If you're interested in cool technology, then SIT is for you. SIT stands for Students Involved with Technology.

There are tons of presentations led by kids, for kids. Some of the most acclaimed presentations are green

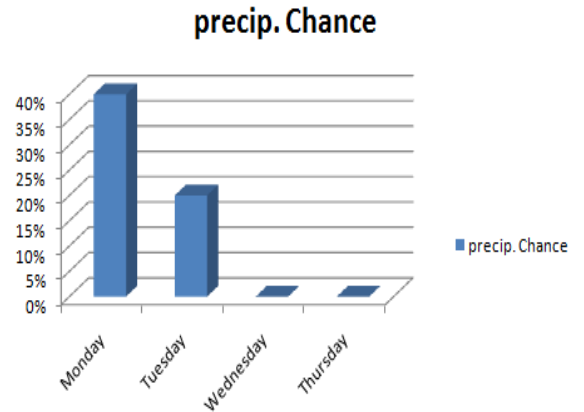

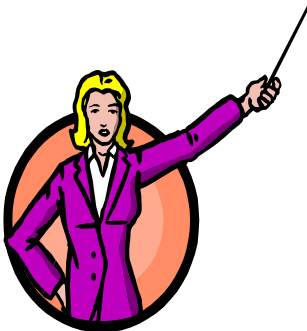

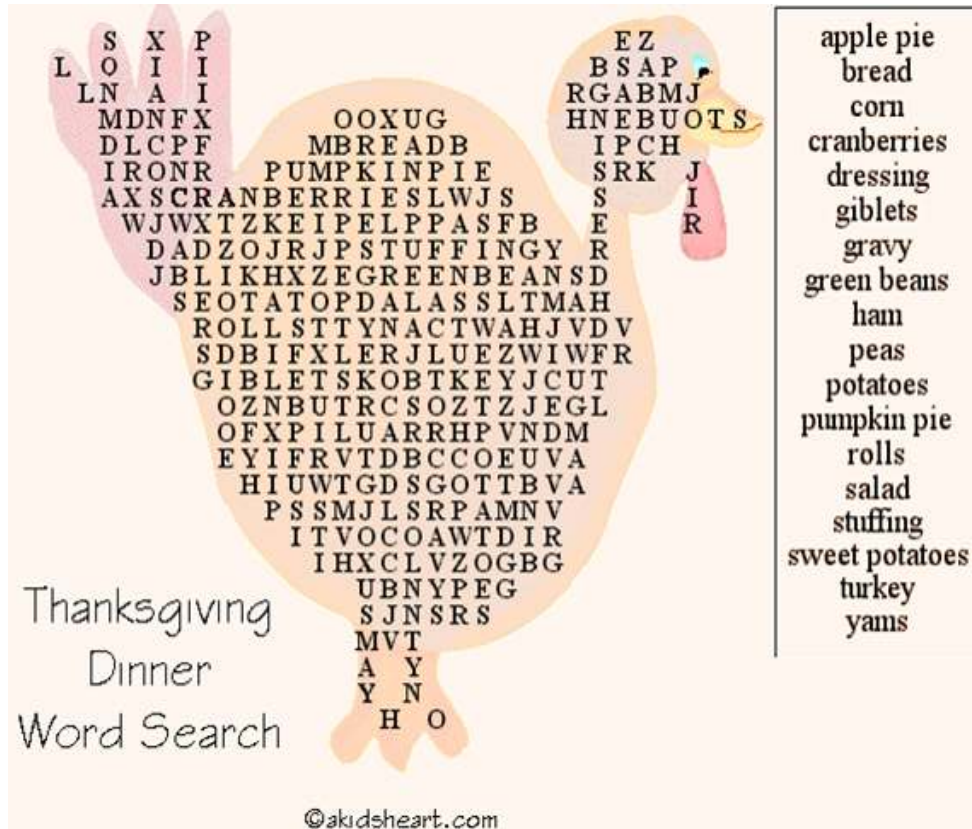
