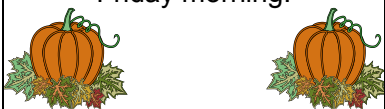

He is originally from Crete, IL where he grew up, but has lived in Bloomington/Normal for the past 5 years while attending ISU. Mr. Behn student taught at Normal Community High School and Lexington High School his senior year of college. At NCHS he taught Introduction to Business and Computer Applications. After graduating from ISU, Mr. Behn joined the Lexington School District as a substitute teacher.

5th Annual Career & Technical Education Festival

On Thursday, November 3rd, 2011, the Bloomington Area Career Center and the McLean County Community COMPACT will host its 5th Annual Career & Technical Education (CTE) Festival at the Interstate Center in Bloomington, IL. The CTE Festival is a two-part all day event.

The Career Expo portion of the festival is attended by over 1500 8th grade students from 12 different schools from McLean/DeWitt counties. The students will take part in educational and interactive activities from vendors and will network with representatives from community organizations, businesses and colleges as well as the students and instructors from BACC programs. This takes place from 8:45am – 2:15pm.

The Community Open House portion of the festival is attended by high school students and their parents and gives them the chance to meet with BACC program instructors as well as business & college representatives. This takes place from 6:00pm – 7:30pm.

Hello, and welcome to the Bloomington Area Career Center (BACC). The 2011-12 school year finds us with over 440 junior and seniors from 15 schools in our 12 different Career and Technical Education programs. The BACC has been in operation since 1968, with the objectives of providing students with experiences that teach technical skills, orientates students to a potential career, all while applying their academic skills.

At the BACC, students are given career exploration opportunities while becoming better prepared for college, advanced training, or the workforce. All of our courses prepare students for postsecondary training in their BACC area of study. Most of our courses offer dual credit or industry-recognized certifications. Last year, over 70 percent of our seniors planned on pursuing postsecondary training (college, community college, specialty school, military) in their area of study at BACC. In addition, 323 students (of 410) either earned dual credit or industry recognized certifications, and many others earned hours toward certifications.

In addition, students will also have the opportunity to build job readiness skills by attending resume and interviewing workshops. Job shadowing opportunities and membership in SkillsUSA is also available to students. SkillsUSA is a co-curricular opportunity that allows students to compete against other students in the state in their training area, while providing students with leadership training.

Information regarding opportunities being offered at BACC will be made available to your students through their classroom teacher. In addition, our website (www.bloomingtonacc.org) also contains information about our programs and the various opportunities we offer.

I encourage you to keep in contact with us throughout the school year, especially with your son or daughter's classroom teacher. Generally, email is the easiest way to contact our teachers. Links can be found on our website for all of our instructors. In addition, you will have opportunities to visit the BACC, for events such as our Open Houses, Parent-Teacher Conferences, and for our awards ceremonies in the spring.

We look forward to providing a unique and challenging experience for your student.

Construction Trades 2011-2012 Project House & Updates

The Building Trades class has started construction of a ranch home in conjunction with Habitat for Humanity. The house is located at 1013 West Front in Bloomington. This will be the seventh home that Habitat for Humanity has started this year. We will be working with other volunteer organizations on this home as well as the family that will eventually occupy the home. The students are currently installing the floor framing.

Students are also currently receiving training from an instructor with OSHA. They will receive the 10 hour OSHA training card upon successful completion. The Core Curriculum of the National Center for Construction Education and Research is being used this year. After passing rigorous written and performance test, the students can earn a nationally recognized certificate.

Hello BACC parents and students. My name is Peggy Bobb and I would like to introduce myself as the Student Services Coordinator for the BACC. There are many opportunities that await your students here at the center.

Each month one second year student is selected to be the BACC Normal Rotary Student of the Month. This student attends Rotary functions and is eligible for a scholarship at the end of the year. Another opportunity for students is to be part of the National Technical Honor Society. This is an organization that honors outstanding student achievement in the career and technical educational fields. Students are nominated by their ACC teachers and then evaluated by a membership panel. Inductions take place second semester.

I also oversee the management of IEP's and accommodations at the center. Mr. Behn and I will meet with students who need extra help understanding and studying their course material. We also work with the instructors and home schools to meet those needs. The BACC ECE Preschool officially opened the school year on September 12, with 17 preschoolers enrolled in the program. While earning either dual credit through Heartland Community College or working on completing the Level 1 ECE Credential through the Gateways to Opportunity Program, ECE students also spend time teaching and assisting in the Preschool Program. Students gain hands on experience in developing lessons that meet the criteria set forth in the Illinois Early Learning Standards. They also gain experience in creating bulletin boards, authoring newsletters and creating safe, welcoming and interactive environments in which children can grow and learn. As the school year progresses, the ECE students will gain a deeper understanding of child growth and development through preschool observations and assessments.

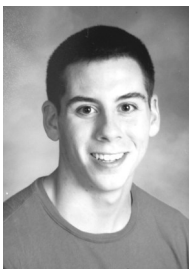
