On September 30, 2009, a powerful earthquake shook western Indonesia. The tremor cut off the power, started fires, and trapped lots of people under collapsed buildings. Many people were trying to get away quickly from the coast by cars and motorbikes. There were children screaming, horns honking and people sitting on the streets to keep from falling.

At least 200 people died and 500 buildings were damaged from this earthquake. Hospitals were full of injured people and they did not have clean water, electricity and communication. The mayor was calling on people to help the city clean up the mess. The amount of damage, injuries, and deaths are still unknown.

We are looking for more volunteers.

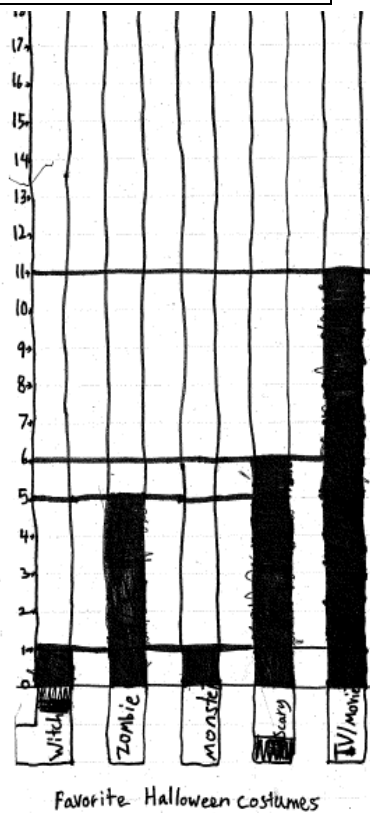

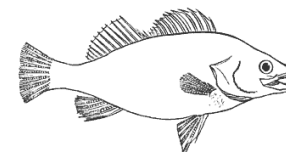
I took a trip to Stanford a week ago. I was visiting my grandma and grandpa. It was fun. One time when I went there, I slept outside with my whole family.

Stevenson School is doing an excellent job. The TV people came to our school during our tornado drill. They thought we were a good school. We have been in the newspaper because other people think we're a good school

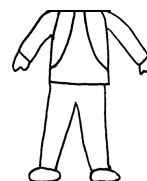

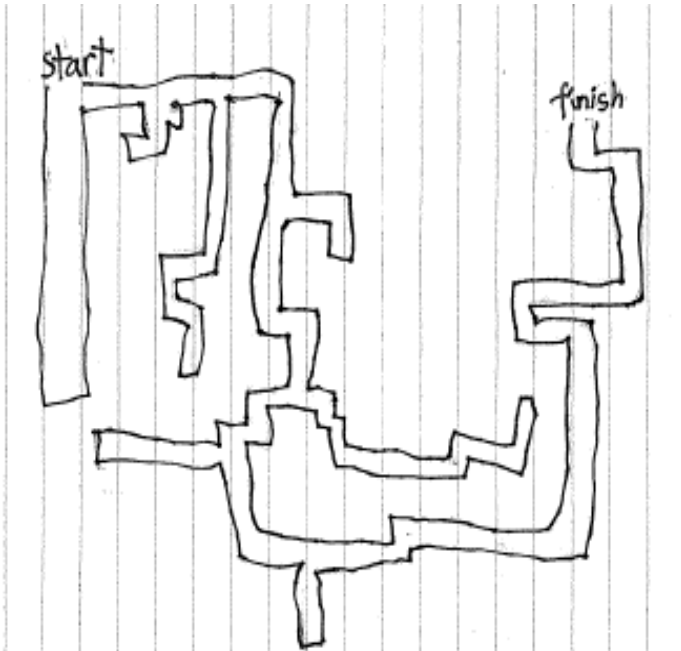
There is a cloud in the sky.

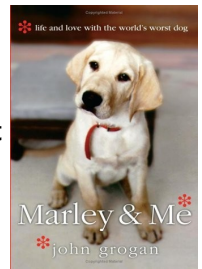
Free Books Thanks to everyone who ordered books from Scholastic Book Clubs this fall, we now have 15 new books for our classroom library. Keep reading!!
