## Exploding Art By Braxton

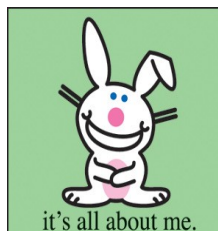

### A Note From Mrs. Buob

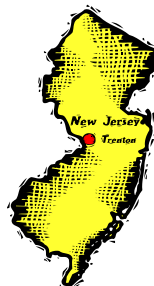

## Northeast Travel

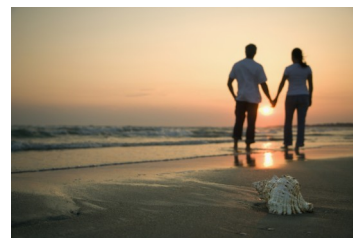
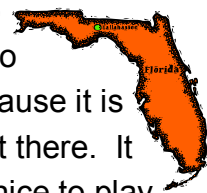

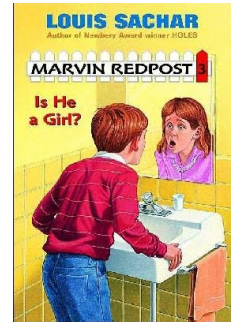
**SIT Conference**
