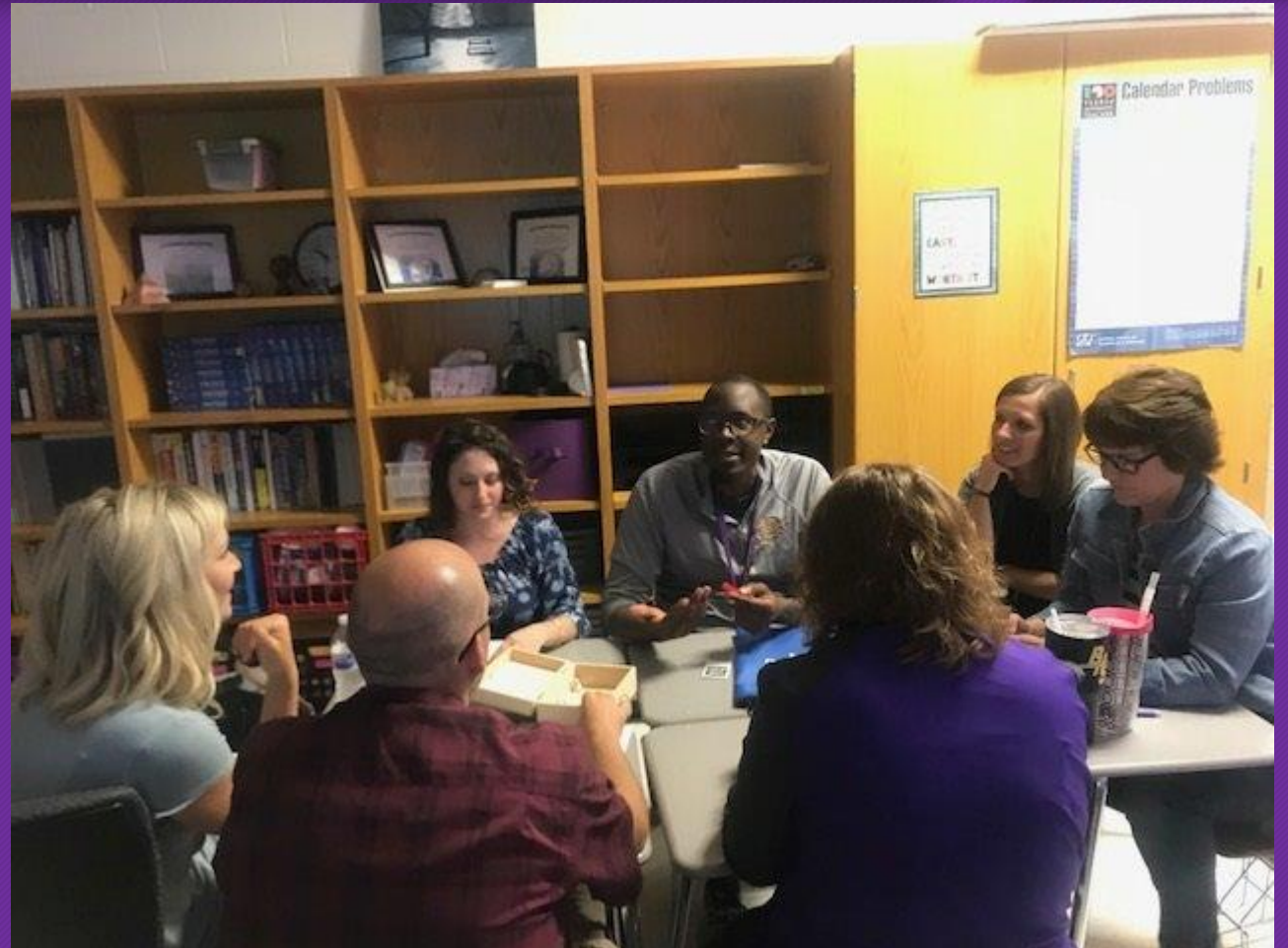
Personnel: We will employ, support, and retain an outstanding and diverse staff. (Secondary)

Finances: We will manage the District's resources and spending as responsible stewards for our taxpayers and community. (Secondary)

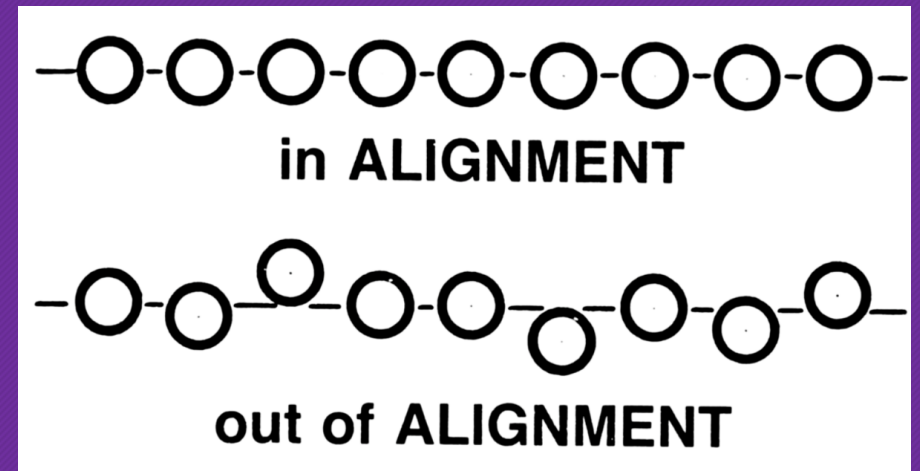

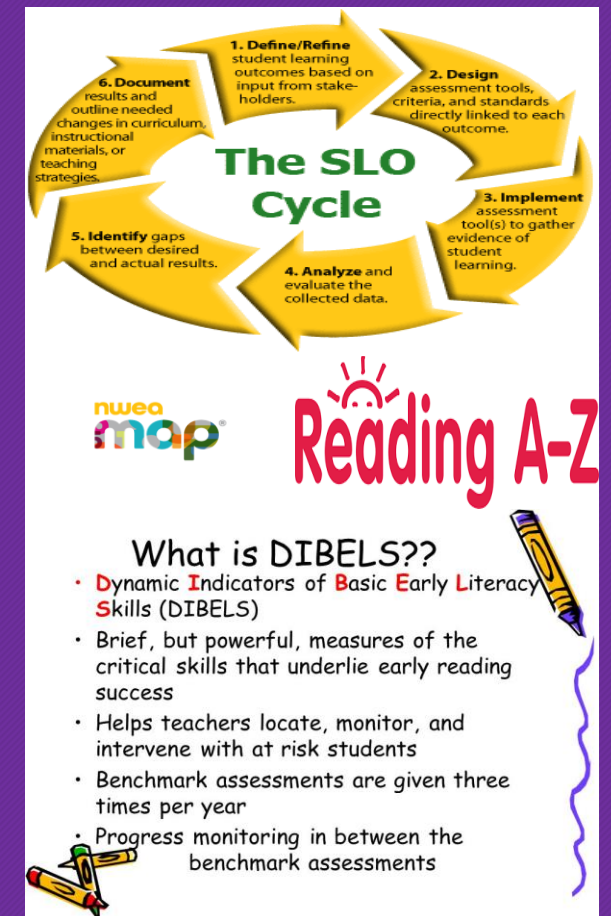
